Heleen ter Pelkwijk: go for it

Izolda Marcinoniene: just through myservice window

bruce muller: Good suggestion, Erik.

Maja Kuna: So I was thinking for tomorrow, we could have like 10 min troubleshooting session. Like, what do you do if? to apply what was on the emergency checklist. But it should be something authentic, like we go offline for 5 minutes, and then we ask them how did they feel? What they wanted to do? Or what would they do as moderators? What mistakes did we do? Or we won/t show up at all:)

Vesa Nietosvaara: Vesa: Just landed in FRA...

I had also one idea in plane. Not at all as extreme as yours. Just show them three things they CANNOT do asynchronously. Hmm?

Maja Kuna: Destroy all the learning experience by going offline? :P

Maja Kuna: Good Vesa. I like both options to be honest. Can we combine? What are the 3 things? We should be creative. Can you play a guitar? Or sing? Sing something in Finnish and ask me to repeat it, then you correct? Or just teach me some words in Finnish and correct my pronunciation on a fly? Something meteorology related?

Vesa Nietosvaara: Vesa: Maja, cycling did good to you again! I like that language practice together. Let's assume we have two participants . . We ask Ms X to teach Mr Y three Lithuanian weather words and pronounce them right.

We need a couple of more such exercises.

Heleen ter Pelkwijk: Yes! Ivan Smiljanic: yes

Maja Kuna: Brainstorming session using whiteboard. But we need a good example.

Vesa Nietosvaara: A current weather map analysis of some kind. Everybody looks weather outside window and places a symbol on map. Hmm. ..

Vesa Nietosvaara: or

Immediate poll on something. Voting if the session should be terminated immediately. If yes votes win, we terminate it immediately.

Vesa Nietosvaara: Aah or! Instruction on how to use some instrument. . showing in webcam how to find @ sign in

German keyboard.

Maja Kuna: Something spontaneous using webcam or voice. Showing with webcam conditions outside and comparing with the real-time forecast, comparing those two.

Izolda Marcinoniene: :)

Vesa Nietosvaara: yes, good idea!

Maja Kuna: Give the feeling of immediacy and co-presence. How?

What is immediate? Emergency. What else? Something that has to be resolved on a spot. NOW.

Vesa Nietosvaara: ehm.... Meeting decision.

Vesa Nietosvaara: or...

Vesa Nietosvaara: for example, when do you use phone call and not use email for communication?

Maja Kuna: Me? Never:)

Vesa Nietosvaara: hah... because you know I am always online

Maja Kuna: It can be used as we said also to correct somebody's actions, on a fly. See the performance and correct, not only voice but a procedure?

Vesa Nietosvaara: Online assessment! Running simulation and viewing how the student handles the system.

Maja Kuna: We should make them (if there are any) to participate as much as possible. I like the simulation, we could use yours for NOMEK to perform a task?

Vesa Nietosvaara: yes we could... but to be safe we could make me a student, share my desktop with everyone and all you would be assessing how i perform with forecasting?

Maja Kuna: OK it sounds to me like we could have 3-4 good examples:

- 1. teaching in Lithuanian a meteorological term (voice)
- 2. comparing the weather conditions outside in a real-time using webcam and then application sharing
- 3. asking somebody to go through a simulation (assessment)
- 4. brainstorming me and you + participants (chat)

Sounds good?

Ivan Smiljanic: do you really type that fast!?!!

Maja Kuna: The end?

Vesa Nietosvaara: we are experts, ivan...;-)

Vesa Nietosvaara: Sounds good!

Izolda Marcinoniene: :)
